We are continuing to work with campus ministry and still need your help through prayers and financial giving. We also have two relatively expensive training sessions before us as we prepare to return to Europe.

We're currently in Minnesota working with the regional office that sent us to France. It's exciting because we can lend them a hand and keep in contact with the new stint team in Toulouse! Then in January we'll start our new staff training. From then on we'll be training and preparing to move to Germany.

Quatre ANY NEWS FROM TOULOUSE?

Yes! The summer project was thrilled to find spiritual thirst as they met students. Many were interested in God, recognizing their need to believe in something (this really is a big step). Here is one story:

"Casey met Pauline while she was waiting to take her last exam, and through broken French and broken English they have established a fun friendship. Casey was able to tell her how

important her faith in Jesus is to her. Pauline doesn't go to church because she doesn't know yet if she believes in God and she doesn't want to be a hypocrite. Her dad has tried to commit suicide four times so she is wrestling between three options: God exists and is good because her dad is still alive, God exists and is mean because of the depression her dad is in, or there is no God. She wants to believe in God and even told Casey that she thinks it is only a matter of time before she truly believes in Him!"



Another remarkable story is of a Bulgarian student studying in Toulouse. In the few weeks they had together, Mark shared the Gospel often with Nyet. The night before they left, Nyet told Mark, "Because of you, I have faith in Jesus now." Praise GOD! Great things he has done!
